Evaluating Rhododendrons and Azaleas Sunday, November 18, 2012

The program for this coming Sunday will include a panel of member growers who will conduct a workshop to explore the following three questions:

- 1. What characteristics are important for evaluating rhododendrons and azaleas?
- 2. How does the Chapter decide what rhododendron and azalea cultivars to offer each spring?
- 3. What characteristics do our members believe are most important?

Peter Hannam, Kevin Kavanagh, Christina Woodward and members of the Niagara Chapter Board will participate in discussion of answers to these questions. They will draw on their own experiences: (1) from work in their gardens; (2) information gleaned from dealing with a wide range of associates in the international gardening community and (3) from commercial growers; from (4) preferences expressed by clients when engaged with landscaping projects; (5) preparing registrations of named cultivars with the American Rhododendron Society; and (5) from listening to members of the Niagara Region Chapter.

The modified evaluation form for the Brueckner Hybrid Evaluation Project will be made available so that sample plants from this project may be evaluated using characteristics listed in this form.

The plants to be evaluated, using criteria in the Brueckner evaluation form, and any other criteria favoured by members will include, R. "Jean's Favorite Blue", an unnamed natural hybrid evergreen azalea (R. kaempheri x R. poukhanense), Brueckner hybrids R. "Bluenose" (R. augustinii, Gable hybrid x R. dauricum sempervirens), Fairy`s Fairy (R. 'Yaku Fairy' x R. keiskei) and Karin Seleger (R. impeditum x R. dauricum, collected by Vasak, NW of Lake Baikal). All but Fairy`s Fairy will be available in the plant raffle draw. Photos below show these plants in bloom.
